### Setup:

- 1. Hot route your tight end to a streak route
- 2. Hot route your Y/triangle receiver to a drag
- 3. Block your running back

### Reads:

- 1. Your first read is still the B/circle receiver if there is press coverage
- 2. If there isn't press coverage, look to your Y/triangle receiver on the drag
- 3. If he is covered, your X/square receiver on the deep in should be open

**Overview:** This is a good 2<sup>nd</sup> way to run the this play even against non press coverage. The deep in route is a really hard route to cover. With these 2 setups, you should be able to run this play for as long as you want. Just make good reads.

- 1. Put the X/square receiver on a smart routed out route

- 1. The main read against cover 2 or cover 2 man is the B/circle receiver (lead pass to the sideline)
- 2. Against cover 3 defenses, your Y/triangle receiver should get open

**Overview:** The B/circle receiver doesn't get bumped which makes this play really effective. If you see press coverage, B/circle will be open. The only real weakness of this play is against man coverage that isn't pressed and cover 4.

- 1. Against cover 3, look to your X/square receiver deep
- 2. Against cover 2, look to your tight end over the middle
- 3. Against other coverages, check down to your B/circle receiver

Overview: This play beats both cover 2 and cover 3 really well.

- 4. Your last read is the X/square receiver on the post, he will usually get open against a cover 2 and cover 3

**Overview**: This play is designed to get either the tight end or the B/circle receiver open against pretty much any coverage.

- 1. Max Protect
- 2. Put your Y/triangle receiver on a drag route

- 2. If he is covered, throw to one of the receivers on the drag route

**Overview**: Eventually your opponent will get smart and try a cover 4 defense instead of cover 2, cover 3, or man to man. When that happens, hit him with this play and beat him deep.

- 2. Your last option is to playmaker the Y/triangle receiver or scramble

**Overview**: This is another good play to mix in with the Gun Doubles schemes.

- 1. Your main read on this play is the running back quickly out of the backfield

### Setup:

- 1. Max Protect
- 2. Hot route your B/circle receiver to a streak route

- 1. The main read on this play is the X/square receiver against cover 2 defenses. Lead pass to the sideline
- 2. If he is covered, look to the Y/triangle receiver on the drag route

Overview: Only call this play if you are expecting cover 2 defense or man to man press coverage.

Play: Cross Drag

### Setup:

- 1. Put your tight end on a fade route
- 2. Block your running back
- 3. Motion your X/square receiver to the left

- 1. Your main read on this play is the Y/triangle receiver as he gets to the right sideline
- 2. You can also hit your B/circle receiver

3. Your last look is the X/square receiver on the deep in

**Overview:** This is another tough play to defend because of the deep crossing route. Mix it in with the Stick play from the same formation.

Play: Spot Option

#### Setup:

- 1. Motion your X/square receiver to the left
- 2. Do whatever you want with your tight end and running back

#### Reads:

- 1. Against a cover 3 or cover 4 defense, look to hit the Y/triangle receiver on his corner route
- 2. If he is covered, one of the other 2 receivers on that side should be open

**Overview**: This play should only be called when you expect a cover 3 or cover 4 defense. Your opponent shouldn't be playing a lot of cover 2 defense after you start beating him with the Stick play.

### Setup:

- 1. Motion your X/square receiver out to the left
- 2. Block the running back
- 3. Put your tight end on an out route

#### Reads:

- 1. Against cover 3 defense, look to throw it to your X/square receiver on a quick pass
- 2. Against cover 3 defense, you can also wait until your B/circle receiver gets all the way to the other side of the field and he can get open.
- 3. Against cover 2, your B/circle receiver should get open as he crosses the field

**Overview**: If you miss your read, just throw the ball away. You don't have a good check down option.

### Setup:

- 1. Use the right stick to flip the run to the other side of the field.

#### Reads:

- 2. If he is covered, your next read is the B/circle receiver

**Overview**: This is the type of play to only call once or twice per game. If your opponent knows it is coming, it won't work.

Setup:

- 1. Put your B/circle receiver on a slant route
- 2. Block your running back

### Reads:

- 1. Your first look is always to the X/square receiver on a quick pass but don't force it
- 2. If he is covered, your tight end or B/circle receiver should be open

**Overview**: This play works best against zone blitzes.

Setup:

- 1. Block both running backs
- 2. Put the B/circle receiver on a streak route

Reads:

1. Look to the A/X receiver coming deep over the middle against a cover 3

- 3. If they are covered, throw a high pass to the A/X receiver at the back of the endzone

**Overview**: This is a red zone play. Mix it in with the FB Inside play from this formation once you get close to the goalline. If your opponent starts dropping 7 or 8 guys into coverage, audible to FB Inside.

- 1. Smart Route the X/square receiver
- 2. Put the A/X receiver on a drag route

#### Reads:

1. Look to the X/square receiver against cover 1 or cover 0 man to man defenses.

**Overview**: We only run this play if we are expecting a man to man blitz or cover 1 defense. The X/square receiver will get open even if our opponent isn't in max coverage.

Play: PA Y-Drag Wheel

### Setup:

- 1. Max Protect
- 2. Put your R1/RB tight end on a fade route
- 3. Put your X/square receiver on a drag route
- 4. (Optional) Slide protect right

### Reads:

- 1. Your B/circle receiver will be open against every coverage in the game unless your opponent manually covers it.
- 2. If he does, then just hit the X/square receiver on the drag route underneath

**Overview**: This play is extremely hard to stop and only sends 3 guys on routes so you have 2 extra blockers.

Setup:

1. Motion the outside receiver in the bunch out to the right

**Overview**: Just follow your blockers. This play usually results in a decent gain.

- 2. If he is covered, look to either drag route

**Overview**: This play can be very hard to stop since your opponent has to manually defend the B/circle receiver's crossing route and then you have a drag on each side as well. Don't force anything.

- 1. The B/circle receiver runs an unbumpable route. If you see press coverage, throw it to that WR (see video for timing). Against cover 2 or cover 2 man, you will have to lead pass to the sideline.
- 2. If the B/circle receiver is covered, look to one of the receivers underneath

**Overview**: If you see press coverage, audible to this play.

**Overview**: We need good cover 4 beaters because the main part of this offense attacks, man to man defense, cover 2, and cover 3. Once we effectively beat a cover 4 deep, our opponent likely won't call it any more which is exactly what we want.

**Overview**: This play can often lead to a big gain on the ground.

**Overview**: This is a good play to take a shot deep from a running formation.

### Setup:

- 1. Put your tight end on a streak route
- 2. Block your running back
- 3. Put your RB/R1 receiver on a drag route

- 1. The first read is always the B/circle receiver on his unbumpable route. He will be open against any press coverage (lead pass to the sideline against cover 2 or cover 2 man)
- 2. If he is covered, read between the slant route and the drag route

**Overview**: This is another play that takes advantage of an unbumpable route on the right side of the screen.

Setup: None required

**Overview**: Follow your blockers. Don't hit the turbo right away. Most of the time, you are going to find the whole between the guard and the fullback.

**Overview**: This play will work against any cover 4 defense. So only call this play if you are playing someone who loves to call cover 4. It helps to have a fast WR in at your WR spot.

**Overview**: This is a deep shot play against cover 4 defenses but the B/circle receiver can get open against other defenses as well.

Setup:

1. (Optional) Block your running back

- 1. Your first read is always the B/circle receiver on the drag route
- 2. Against cover 2, look to the RB/R1 receiver on the corner route
- 3. Against cover 3, look to the X/square receiver on the post route
- 4. The final read is the tight end coming back across the middle of the field

**Overview**: This is a really hard play to stop if you are good with making reads. Unfortunately, there isn't 1 easy read on this play.

Setup: None required

**Overview**: Once your opponent starts worrying about all of the different passing options from this formation and starts dropping extra guys into coverage, hit him with the HB Draw. This play won't be effective if he is blitzing extra guys.

Reads:

- 1. Against a cover 4, look to the X/square receiver deep
- 2. Against a cover 2, the X/square receiver will get open a little quicker. Throw it when he cuts toward the middle of the field

Overview: This play is designed to beat a cover 4 defense, but it will also beat a cover 2 as well.

Formation: Gun Empty Trey Stack

Play: Fade Out

Setup:

1. Hot route your B/circle receiver to a drag route

### Reads:

- 1. Your first look is always to the X/square receiver on a quick pass. He will be open against cover 3
- 2. If he is covered, immediately look to the B/circle receiver on the drag underneath
- 3. You also have the A/X receiver deeper over the middle as well

**Overview**: This is a really good quick pass where one of the first 2 reads is pretty much always open.

Formation: Gun Empty Trey Stack

Play: Smash Seam

### Setup:

- 1. Hot route your B/circle receiver to a smoke screen
- 2. Smart route the A/X receiver
- 3. Smart route your X/square receiver

### Reads:

- 1. Against cover 3, cover 1, and others your RB/R1 tight end will get wide open for a second. It takes a little timing but lead pass it to the sideline.
- 2. If he is covered, look to the A/X receiver or the receivers on the left

**Overview:** This play can torch most defenses. Mix it in with Fade Out. You really need to practice the timing on this one otherwise you will throw lots of interceptions. Only call this play if you know what you are doing.

Formation: Special Teams Punt

Play: Fake Punt Sweep

Setup:

- 1. Sub in your best or fastest running back at the punt protector spot where your fullback normally is
- 2. Put your best offensive lineman in the long snapper spot (You can do this before the game in the depth chart).

**Overview**: You will want to make the substitution early on in the game so if you do call a fake punt, it won't take you any extra time and won't alert your opponent that something might be up. This is generally good for at least 5 yards, sometimes more. Just follow your blockers right up the middle. There should be a huge hole.

It only works against punt return left, punt return middle, and punt return right so if you see a punt block or a punt return safe man, audible to a normal punt. 99% of the time, your opponents will call a punt return though so this should work if you save it for the right time.

Play: Fake Punt FB Pass

Setup: None required

### Reads:

1. Your only read on this play is the receiver on the left (the X/square receiver)

**Overview**: Against most punt returns, the receiver on the left will get bumped at the line of scrimmage and the cornerback will stumble. Throw it right after the bump (see the video for timing). This play can sometimes fail if the ball is thrown inaccurately but the receiver will usually be open.

This play is usually good for about 12-16 yards. You will have to practice how hard to throw the pass. Too soft or too hard and it will be inaccurate. Obviously, don't call this play if your opponent is expecting the fake. It will not work.

### Setup:

- 1. Put your X/square receiver on an in route
- 2. Put your tight end on a drag route
- 3. Block your running back

### Reads:

- 1. Against any cover 3 defense that has hard flats or cloud flats, the Y/triangle receiver will be wide open
- 2. Against cover 2 defenses, the B/circle receiver will be open deep and the Y/triangle receiver can get open (lead pass to the sideline)
- 3. Look to your 2 underneath routes if everything else is covered

**Overview**: This play only works on All-Madden difficulty. It works best if you hit your tight end on the drag route a couple times. Your opponent will eventually go to a hard flat defense and that is when you hit him deep.

Play: PA Post Shot (Version 1)

Setup:

- 1. Put your tight end on a fade route
- 2. Put your Y/triangle receiver on a drag route
- 3. Smart route your X/square receiver
- 4. Block your running back

### Reads:

- 1. Against most defenses, your primary read is the B/circle receiver which can't be defended by any common defense unless your opponent user defends him.
- 2. If he is covered, look to the Y/triangle receiver on the drag route
- 3. Your last read is the X/square receiver who should get open against cover 2.

**Overview**: This play is extremely hard to stop because of the route the B/circle receiver runs.

Play: PA Post Shot (Version 2)

#### Setup:

- 1. Put your X/square receiver on a smart routed out route
- 2. Put your B/circle receiver on a streak route
- 3. Put your tight end on a fade route
- 4. (Optional) Block your running back
- 5. Motion your Y/triangle receiver to the right

#### Reads:

- 1. Against cover 3, hit your B/circle receiver (lead pass to the sideline)
- 2. Against cover 3 with the 2 deep corners in deep half zones (a common coverage among competitive players) hit the Y/triangle receiver along the sideline. See video for timing
- Against cover 4 defenses, wait for the Y/triangle receiver to stop and the play to develop a little. Once the cornerback on the right turns his back to cover the tight end, hit your Y/triangle receiver.

**Overview**: Run this play from the middle of the field or the left side of the field to give your Y/triangle receiver room along the sideline. This is a shot play. We have no checkdown whatsoever so only call it when you need a big play.

**Overview**: Just quick snap it if you like the look the defense is giving you. This is one of the most effective running plays in the game. Run it until your opponent stops you.

- 2. Put your tight end on a drag route
- 3. Put your X/square receiver on an in route

### Reads:

- 2. Against cover 2 defenses, both your Y/triangle receiver will be open and your B/circle receiver will be open
- 3. Against cover 3 or cover 4 defenses, hit one of the underneath routes.

**Overview**: This play absolutely destroys cover 2 defenses.

Play: Fade Smash (Version 2)

### Setup:

- 1. Block your running back
- 2. Put your tight end on a streak route
- 3. Put your B/circle receiver on a slant route
- 4. Put your X/square receiver on a smart routed out route
- 5. (Optional) Slide protect right
- 6. Motion your Y/triangle receiver to the right and snap it right when he gets past the tight end

- 1. Your main read on this play is your Y/triangle receiver once he gets open. Against cover 2 he will get open a little sooner. Against Cover 3 wait until he gets open deeper
- 2. If your opponent user defends the Y/triangle receiver, we have our B/circle receiver going the other way on the slant.

**Overview**: This play makes your opponent's user make a tough decision. He'll have to show you which way he is going to go and it will make the read very easy.

### Setup:

- 1. Put your Y/triangle receiver on a slant route
- 2. Put your running back on an out route

#### Reads:

- 1. The main read on this play is the Y/triangle receiver against cover 3 and cover 4 defenses. Lead pass up as he gets all the way across the field
- 2. If he is covered, look to your running back in the flat or to the other side of the field.

**Overview**: This play works well against max coverage cover 3 defenses. Don't call it if you expect a blitz or if your opponent has a good user.

Play: Levels Sail

Setup:

- 1. Put your tight end on a fade route
- 2. Quick hike so your opponent doesn't have time to set up his defense

#### Reads:

- 1. If your opponent has purple zones on the field, your running back in the flat will be wide open (lead pass up)
- 2. If he is covered, look to one of your receivers underneath or throw the ball away

**Overview**: This play works best if you run it from the left hash. Your running back needs room to get open. If you run it from the middle or the right, your running back might go out of bounds before he catches it. This is a very important play to make your opponent go to hard flats or cloud flats.
